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Objectives of the Club

To promote those objectives endorsed by Surf Life Saving (WA.)

- a) To promote and enforce the work of the Surf Life Saving Association, the resuscitation of the apparently drowned and the application of first aid on the beachfront between Cable Beach, Mosman Park and Napier Street, Cottesloe.
- b) To carry out patrols in accordance with the regulations of Surf Life Saving (WA) and provide the necessary efficient life saving equipment.
- c) To co-operate with other organizations in enforcing life saving methods and equipment.
- d) To educate the public surf awareness and current resuscitation procedures and encourage members of the public to gain awards as permitted by Surf Life Saving (WA).
- e) To partake in competitions and events in all surf life saving areas and other areas permitted by Surf Life Saving (WA) and to sponsor members to complete.
- f) To co-operate with the Town of Cottesloe in possible improvements to beach facilities.

In Addition:

- a) To acquire by purchase, exchange or otherwise whether for an estate in fee simple or for any less estate lands and tenements or real personal property or any tenure thereof, whether subject or not to any changes, or encumbrances, and to erect, replace, maintain, reconstruct, adapt and furnish any offices, buildings, or lands, tenements or property or any part thereof after approval by a Club General Meeting.
- b) To borrow any monies required for the purpose of the Club upon such terms and conditions as may be determined and for that purpose to mortgage, pledge or otherwise charge any real or personal property of the Club.
- c) To invest funds of the Club, when available, providing that investments shall be in trustee securities only.
- d) To employ staff as required to administer and promote the objectives of the Club.
- e) To do all or any of the matters authorized either alone or in conjunction with any person, company or unincorporated body through any factors, trustees or agents.
- f) To do all such things as they appear to the Club to be incidental or conducive to the attainment of the foregoing objectives or any of them.

Celebrating 40 Years of Women in Surf Life Saving

July 1 2020 marks the 40 year anniversary of Women in Surf Life Saving being able to gain their Bronze Medallion and participate as active surf lifesavers in surf clubs around Australia. While this anniversary celebrates the formal introduction of women in Surf Life Saving at a national level, women have been involved at all different levels of Surf Life Saving since its early inception in 1907.

Margaret Bond, Kerryn Briody, Tanya Franz (Campbell), Sally Johnston (Johnson) & Jenny Taylor (Dennehy), after training with Instructor & Club Captain, John Barrington, sat for their Bronze Medallion Award on Sunday 6 July 1980. In their first season as full members, Marg and Kerryn took on Office Bearer roles within the club.

Excerpt from the 1980-81 Cottesloe SLSC Annual Report from Club Captain, John Barrington: "Cottesloe was equal first in Australia to have females qualify for the bronze medallion.

Ten went for this award on Sunday, 6th July. He felt their enthusiasm and dedication will carry over into patrol work and general attitude to the club. Cottesloe is the only club

on the coast to have females qualified, and suggests the club actively encourages women to join our ranks as fully qualified members. Physical and physiological differences of the sexes must be taken into account, and if we don't allow for these differences, we could lose brilliant and talented members".



It is great to see that many are still actively involved with surf lifesaving with Marg and Tanya remaining members at Cott. Sally's brothers are also members at Cottesloe SLSC.

Cott has many stories of women and their achievements at our club so, to all our wonderful women. A wonderful contribution to the movement from everyone involved.

Graham was born 9 April 1950. He originally contributed to Cottesloe SLSC as part of the annual 100-Club in the late 1990's and subsequently joined as an Active member obtaining his Bronze Medallion No WA11267 (WA5838664) on 5 March 2003.

As an active patrolling member, Graham continue to develop his lifesaving skills obtaining his Advanced Resuscitation Certificate on 27 October 2004 and his Surf Official Level 1 SLSA Education Award on 24 May 2012. He then attended SLSWA surf carnivals in 2012, 2013 & 2014 fulfilling our Club's obligation to supply officials and assisting our athletes compete in these events.

Graham made a valuable contribution to the club as a member of the Finance Committee for six years from 2002/2003 - 2007/2008 - an important yet rarely recognised part of the club. He was Club Treasurer for three of those years from 2004/2005 - 2006/2007.

An outstanding aspect of his contribution has been the establishment and ongoing success of the Club's Sponsorship Committee which he established in 2008/2009. This included a new sponsorship structure that enabled the Club to better engage with and obtain corporate support.

Graham has continued, to the current date, to chair the Sponsorship Committee. In that period, the Committee has raised considerable income from Sponsors plus an estimated \$300,000 to \$350,000 in contra support for the club.

He has been a dedicated supporter of Sunday club activities and has always demonstrated a willingness to assist where he can, including for the last few years with the organisation of the Cottesloe Classic Mile©.

More broadly, Graham demonstrates a most genuine and inspiring example for others to follow. His positive approach, care and respect for fellow members has provided an immeasurable benefit to the club.

President Report

Members,

Once again it is with great pleasure that we present to you the 111th Annual Report for Cottesloe SLSC on behalf of the management and sub committees for the 2019/20 season.

As a club we have continued to grow the positiveness from the previous year. Friday night Stubby Stakes, food trucks and Sunday activities are all hives of activity and enjoyable to sit back and watch. Another great example was the preparedness of the members to assist with the Cottesloe Classic Mile© (over 100 helpers) and the Sculptures Sausage Sizzles.

Because of COVID-19, our season came to a halt. We have a lot of disappointed competitors of all ages that, for no reason of their own, could not show their fitness and skills at the State and National competitions.

There was one highlight here. Courtney Franz was selected to represent the Broome Pearlers in the inaugural Interstate Surf League competition and then also selected as a member of the Western Suns State Team to compete at the Sunshine Coast, Queensland, in January. Well done Courtney.

Work is continuing with the building and we are waiting for development approval. The Minderoo proposals for the Indiana site are also still developing along with the relocation of the boatshed.

On July 1st, 1980 Surf Life Saving Australia officially acknowledged women in surf, allowing them to obtain their surf Bronze Medallion. This year is the 40th anniversary of this. We acknowledge all the ladies past and present, that have and continue to contribute to Surf Life Saving. Some of these ladies have had a fantastic influence on the present-day surf clubs. Cottesloe was the first club

in WA and only by hours, second in Australia to have a team of female bronze holders. Coached by Life Member, John Barrington AO, we still have 2 of that original group involved at Cottesloe: Marg Bond, Life Member and Tanya Franz (Nee Campbell).

Surf Life Saving has 4 pillars that it operates around:

Life Saving

Under the guidance of Deb Dean over the past 2 years we now have a strong list of patrols and work being done to further strengthen this.

Education

This area, whilst not perfect, has improved immensely thanks to our Trainers. Next season we have a Chief Instructor and this is going to allow us to engage more with those members that do not compete but want to help in other areas.

Both above areas are controlled by our Lifesaving Officer. Deb Dean has accepted the role for next year and Courtney Franz will assist her with the education. Deb is currently talking to potential members to be Patrol Officer who, with Deb's experience & guidance, will continue to grow this important area.

Surf Sports

Whilst we do not have a Club Captain, this area is improving. We have a full suite of coaches already in place and training squads under way and we can only get stronger in competition.

Youth & Nippers

Our Woodside Nippers program is running very well under the guidance of Julian Barry. Jason Kennington has also

been great in the youth area and is growing into the role. With the plans for next year coupled with the Life Saving and Education areas, this area I believe will take huge steps forward.

I have had the opportunity over the past weeks to sit back and reflect on where we are as a club. My reason to run for President was simply to help get the club back on track. Deputy President Report

Members,

2020 has been an interesting year. From my perspective, my role as Deputy President has been primarily to be the President's backup and in charge of facilities, incorporating Gym, Bar, Café, Boatshed, Functions, and Social Activities. The team remains the same as last year with Ditte managing the bar as licensee, Owen "Major" Ashby the café, Jo Suda, functions and social activities, Leesa Matier the kitchen & lan Cook in the gym.

The building has this year presented the club with challenges. We are constantly having to spend money fixing or replacing some part of it - mostly due the harshness of the prevailing weather conditions. Plumbing and electrical repairs and maintenance have been significant, and expensive, with no respite foreseeable in the immediate future.

The building renovation plans were submitted to the Town of Cottesloe for development approval. This was granted subject to a favourable traffic study being undertaken which has now been done. In addition, there has to be a review of the Norfolk pine adjacent to the South West corner of the building. This would need to be removed as part of the development. Initial advice is that will not be an issue. Management is currently working on fund raising models, for Local, State and National Government assistance. The club has tax deductible donations status and it is hoped that club members will contribute to fund raising activities once they commence. It will be a challenge for us as club due the cash drain on the Government providing COVID-19 relief.

Social activities have once again been well supported this year. Although we did not have a headline business lunch this year, we did have regular members' evenings such as the champagne tasting evening, Augustfest, Gin tasting, and Grand Final Day organised by Jo Suda and Sam Cowie and their team of helpers.

The Cott café once again plays an important role in the socialisation focus of the club, especially on mornings that the HIT sessions are run in the gym, and on Sunday mornings during the season.

CottCafé (Report Owen "Major" Ashby)

The Cott Pylon Café has continued to play a significant part in the Club's fundraising activities, despite the short season because of the COVID-19 closure in mid-March 2020. Season 2020/21 income will also be affected.

The coffee machine continues to operate satisfactorily since it was installed in 2015.

- It has been serviced twice during the season, in September and March, in line with recommended service criteria by service provider SegaFredo Coffee.
- Profit from the Café has again topped \$20K however the COVID-19 closure affected income at the busier time of the season. Profits from the Café since the coffee machine was installed in season 2006/7 have contributed to the \$295,000 raised through the Café.

The Cott Pylon Café has not only provided another substantial income stream for the club (see accounts report), it has provided members of an all year meeting place to socialise and utilise club facilities. The Café use has substantially increased in line with gymnasium use. The club, whilst it is generally underutilized, gives beach and gymnasium users a reason to stay for a coffee and a chat on opening days, i.e. Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

A paid Barista was employed on Sunday mornings & each rotated their shifts throughout the season; namely, Sophie Butler, Beth Naim, Amy Ivey, Claire Ivey, Madison Lucas, Emilia and Jamie Marshall.

Acknowledgment and thanks are given to the Junior Activities Officer, Julian Barry, along with parent, Paul Townsend, for their untiring efforts in organising parents for the cooking of the sausage sizzle each Sunday morning.

The assistance from an administrative staff and support by Ditte van der Linde and Margaret Bond has to be acknowledged. My penultimate thanks again go to Charlie Nash for his worldly advice on how to operate and clean the

Café and his ever reliability in tidying up. I was reminded of this every day. Graeme Johnson and Geoff Dienhoff also assisted in keeping the Café orderly throughout the season.

Finally, a big thank you to you all, particularly the wonderful parents of Nippers who have assisted and supported the Café on Sunday mornings, as without you the Cott Pylon Café would not operate as successfully as it has during the 2019/20 season. I look forward to another successful year in 2020/21 with expectations of a much larger café and an additional ground floor kitchen in the proposed building renovation.

Venue Hire (Report Ditte van der Linde)

Since the 2018/2019 season, the Bar Manager position is also the responsibility of the Administrator. The aim of the bar is to provide a continuous revenue stream to assist the club in delivering front line activities and connecting members via social events.

Despite the closure of the club in March, the bar/venue has performed well again this year with more than \$50,000 in profit from bar sales and hiring the venue. There has been ongoing focus on stock control, reducing wastage and complying with the Liquor Licencing requirements. The Club greatly appreciates that members and guests are doing the right thing and adhering to all liquor licence rules and regulations.

I wish to extend my sincere thanks to David Craig (Deputy President) for his involvement, Michael McDonnell (Facilities) for his assistance in preparing the venue, and the entire bar staff for delivering valuable functions and events to members and guests.

I look forward to working with the current and new office bearers, bar team, volunteers and members next season.

Gym (Report Ian Cook, Strength & Conditioning Coach)

This last year we saw the gym continue to become a big part of the club with gym attendance growing steadily and the clubs athletes taking full advantage of the great hub and facility we have.

Thanks in part to the gym becoming such a well used facility and in need of some up dating we were lucky enough to receive some much needed new equipment this year which in turn will greatly benefit not only the clubs athletes but also the clubs wider member base.

As per previous years the Dads Army sessions every Monday-Wednesday-Friday mornings have continued to develop and become a more athletically focused session with progressions and regressions available for all walks of life. This is one of my favourite times in the gym as I get to see young and old, fit and not so fit having fun and laughing while sweating it out and working hard to become stronger, fitter, faster.

Our gym is many things to many people but mostly it feels like it has become a place for our members to do things they never thought they could, whether it be squatting pain free for the first time in a while or learning a new Olympic lifting technique to help build power for the surf sports, the gym is a judgement free awesome place to be.

Here's to a big coming year with pre-season S&C coming into focus soon.

Conclusion

Finally, I would like to specifically thank Marg Bond for the enormous amount of time and effort she put into the safety plans required to enable the club to re-open after the COVID-19 shut down at the end of March. It was made more stressful by the Government's changing dates and conditions, but Marg took it all in her stride.

Treasurer Report

The Club's financial surplus improved substantially this year compared to the last two years. The Club returned a surplus of \$112,936 and an increase in total cash balances of \$47,833. There are a number of reasons for the difference between the surplus and change in cash - depreciation of assets, grants and sponsorship in kind, movement in stock, timing of sponsorship revenue and receipts as examples. Ultimately, it is total available cash that is the most important financial number and measurement for the Club and will drive the Club forward.

To highlight some details, the Café as always continues to be well managed and is very profitable, membership fees decreased slightly, there was a substantial increase in the performance of the bar and functions, the apparel shop sales decreased, Friday night activities continued to be popular, and the Cottesloe Mile was a financial success. The Club also received the benefit from the Foundation higher interest earned on term deposits. In terms of operating costs there were some small variances compared to last year but in total costs were similar. We were fortunate to have resolved an insurance claim this year that resulted in the recovery of approximately \$30,000. In addition, COVID 19 only impacted the Club for the last 6 or 7 weeks of this financial year. Unfortunately, the 2020/2021 year results to date are suffering badly from COVID 19.

The Club held \$188,809 cash at the end of the year. The Foundation cash increased substantially by \$170,431, growing to \$715,685. These very strong and healthy cash balances will sustain the Club well into the future. As I have said in previous reports it is a goal of the current management committee (excluding the building costs issue) to achieve a total cash target of \$1,000,000 by 30 April 2022. We are well on the way to achieving this target.

Without taking away from other parts of the Club, the highlight of the year financially was the fundraising effort during Sculptures by the Sea. Over the three-week period this delivered good financial gains for the Club. The entire commitment by members is terrific to see. There are too many people to mention, but the endeavour shown by the entire Club was fantastic.

I am sure with ongoing financial focus; the Club will continue to prosper in future years. We have maintained to adhering to the three-year capital expenditure plan (excluding the building redevelopment) in upgrading equipment. To become a desired Club of choice in a competitive market, we must have first class equipment for members and competitors.

Marg still works a considerable number of hours voluntarily (which she has done for a number of years) in the office on top of the salaried duties.

Myles Kennington (the club Technical Support Officer - unofficial) contributes a significant number of volunteer hours in advising, innovating and maintaining the computer and telephone systems in the office; the Cottesloe Surf Club sincerely thanks Myles for his time and efforts.

Although not in my jurisdiction, I would like to acknowledge Tash Leaversuch (the overt) and Peter Leaversuch (the covert) in terms of who does the handicapping and who advises on the handicapping for the Stubby Stakes conducted on Friday evenings at 6 pm (almost sharp). A job well done and it provides a lot of humour, competitiveness and porky pies. Thanks Tash.

Member Protection Information Officer

This area of the Club is now very efficiently organised and functional. Each member is being carefully recorded

regarding the Working With Children (WWC) accreditation that is now a mandatory requirement by the relevant authorities for surf life saving activities. Whilst no system is absolutely foolproof, the system put in place by MPIO, Wendy Craig, is most efficient and thorough.

Phoebe also gets publicity in local newspapers and takes many photos of the many activities taking place at Cottesloe Surf Club and Beach during the season. The Cottesloe Surf Club very much appreciates your efforts Phoebe.

Boaties (Report Michael Ivey)

Cottesloe was represented by three crews during the season "Cooee", "AnL" and the "Muppets".

The Muppets were swept and trained by Wayne Adams, Gavin Pascoe and Paul Beattie, with Chad Burling, Jeffrey Burling, Stuart Turnbull, Terrance Upston, Geoff Dienhoff and Willow Williamson assisting during the season. The Muppets crew (Lenny Tenten, Mike Ivey, Stuart Cowie, Myles Kennington and Marcel Baird) represented Cottesloe at the SunSmart WA Surf League competing against open crews during the 3 carnival season. Round 1 at Secret Harbour they achieved 6th place, Round 2 at Scarborough Beach saw the Muppets make the final and catch a sneaky wave on the way home to get 3rd place. Round 3 at Sorrento Beach they again made the final but unfortunately fill in sweep Mark Donnelly hit a hole at the start that collapsed his knee and the boat did not leave the beach. August 2019 saw Paul Beattie sweep the Muppets to victory in the 160 years+ division, 15km Avon Surf Challenge. The Muppets also recorded the second fastest time on the day at 1hr 23min. In the 2019 SunSmart WA Endurance Championships the Muppets rowed hard into second place in a close contest before a sliding seat mishap derailed their chances for a place 200m from the finish.

The State Masters saw all three crews head to Denmark. Congratulations to the following Cottesloe Teams:

Open 5 female team - Joelle Matier, Eliza Jackson, Gemmaley Walsh, Karlene Craven and Elizabeth McAskil winning bronze in a straightout final of 5 teams. Just 2 points away from 1st.

Under 11 Mixed 2 Person - Carla Chipperfield and Zara Jones - making the final and coming 6th overall in their 1st year of competing - a great result. Abby Bryndzej and Kelsey Cairney also competed in the U11 2 person event - Abby and Kelsey did well given it was also their 1st year in R & R.

Under 13 Mixed 2 Person - Annabel Hurst and Chloe Savage - competed giving a great performance and just missed the final, coming 7th overall.

A good all round performance from Cottesloe competitors and coaches.

Masters (Report Stuart Cowie)

The 2020 SunSmart WA Masters Surf Life Saving Championships were held in Denmark this year, although,

due to rough conditions on the second day, the boats were transferred to Middleton Beach in Albany. The conditions were not much better there and the Open events were cancelled after the Masters boat events had finished. Cottesloe had 17 competitors who travelled to Denmark and had a very successful Championships in both individual and team events, with every competitor winning at least one medal.

There were 8 Gold medals, 5 Silver medals and 7 Bronze medals won overall (see details later in the Report).

Congratulations to all Masters' competitors.

Unfortunately competitions were cancelled shortly after the State Masters due to the COVID-19 pandemic, including the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships and the Lifesaving World Championships which were scheduled to be held in Italy.

State Team Representative (Report Courtney Franz)

With this being my fourth state team and first as an open competitor, it was an amazing experience to go up against some of the top athletes from each state. Due to having the 3rd round of the Super Surf League a week before, half the team met us in Queensland, so the flight over was very low key, compared to that of previous years.

Once there, we had a couple of training sessions prior to the carnival, where we could become familiar competing in team events with our new teammates (particularly the beach relay). During the Interstate Championship carnival, the open women's beach relay came 4th and I took 5th in the flags. Overall WA took 3rd for the carnival.

The following day we competed at the Maroochydore Classic. Having competed the day prior some of us were

a little sore and tired, but overall WA came away with some pleasing results. I didn't have a good day in the flags; however, made it to the semi-finals in the sprint (missing out by one to get into the final).

The experience was fantastic, and a privilege to compete with other members from the WA Surf Lifesaving community.

Handicapper (Report Ben Stephens)

The Club Swim, held each Sunday at 10:30 AM, proved once again to be an extremely popular event. This season was the first that had to contend with the new shark barrier, which did result in some course modifications and, on occasions, a few too many turns. It does remain a challenge scheduling trophy swims on days when most swimmers are at the Club and not competing at carnivals or other swims and as a result some of the trophy swims could be better ordered for 2020/21 - so that current swim information is available for handicapping.

Special thanks must go to Jim Laurenson, Gail Robertson, Helen Franks and Sonja Madden for their work in registering, marshalling, starting and recording the swims each Sunday. Thanks also to the IRB drivers and crew (and occasional board paddlers) that set the courses, in particular Mike Ivey, Marcel Baird and Phoebe Packard who set the permanent course and contended with the shark barrier. Special mentions to Stephen Goddard and Chad Burling for their timely assistance.

While there is no shortage of unsolicited advice from swimmers and particularly from former Handicappers (some of which is helpful) I would like to extend my thanks to Greg Madden for his continued support and solicited advice on the behind-the-scenes part of the Handicapping.

The season obviously didn't end as we would have liked, but congratulations to all the competitors across the season who made the Club Swim a great success and to the Trophy and Points winners detailed elsewhere in this report.

May we look forward to the chorus of boos directed at the Handicapper for the summer of 2020/21!

Conclusion

Amidst all the confusion and disappointment of the ending to our season we had some brilliant results throughout the year. The club pulled its collective socks up and put together great teams to compete in all three rounds of SLSWA Surf leagues. We also had great representation at the senior and nipper carnivals. The Country carnival was a highlight for our boaties with the Muppets racing in the correct event for once and showing what they were made of to finish with some much deserved silverware. The club also had one of our much loved athletes chosen for two representative squads, Broome Pearlers and Western Suns, showing that hard work and determination pays off.

Lastly I'd like to thank the competition committee for stepping up when needed and without having to be asked during this past season, it's been an interesting season to say the least but one in which the club has grown and learnt from. I along with everyone else look forward with great excitement to the up & coming season and all that will come along with it.

Lifesaving Report

Dear Members

The summer of 2019/2020 for CSLSC was always destined to be a significant season for our Club, with the installation of the Eco-shark barrier placing a spotlight on Cottesloe Beach. West Australian and local community opinion was polarised prior to the installation early in November however at season's end the consensus is now overwhelmingly in favour of the barrier. Beach attendances are up, young member enrolments are rising, serious incidents are down and, most importantly, beach-goers now enjoy the benefits of Perth's favourite beach with this extra level of security providing peace of mind to all.

It is a pleasure to report that CSLSC members contributed over 6600 patrol hours, a decrease of approximately 200 hours on the previous year. This can be attributed to the reduced number of patrolling members on the beach the last two weeks of the season due to the outbreak of COVID-19 and the Club prioritizing the health and well-being of our members. With just over 300 members eligible to patrol we punch well above our membership 'weight', demonstrating the strength of volunteer commitment to our Club and its core operation. These increased numbers reflect new energy being injected into Club training as we increase the number of trainers to remedy the onerous training and assessment demands on the existing small pool of dedicated trainers. Sincerest thanks to all Club trainers and assessors without whom we would not have a proficient pool of qualified members ready for whatever might occur during their patrols.

Patrols

For the 2019-20 season we had 14 Patrol Teams, with a minimum of six rostered patrols (averaging eight patrols) and a minimum of 12 members on each patrol. Most patrols now have an IRB Driver and IRB Crew members and a short-term goal would be to ensure all patrols for future seasons have at least one driver and crew available for all rostered patrols. Whilst our patrol area extends from Cable Station, Mosman Park to Napier Street, Cottesloe, we are frequently the only club between Fremantle and Swanbourne with an operational IRB in the late afternoons so our services are often called upon for additional surveillance beyond our nominated patrol area.

We had three new Patrol Captains lead teams this year: Paul McCarthy (Kay Patrol), Libby Madden (Lahiff Patrol) and Joelle Matier (Hofmaster Patrol), each of whom provided guidance and enthusiasm to their patrol teams. As the Patrol Officer writing this report, Monday morning emails were something to be opened with a slight sense of 'dread' - however this season has been quite the opposite, with the very rare issue or problem occurring on the



weekends - testament to the proficiency of all of those on patrol. It would be a travesty to single out any patrol team, or single event for what was truly a combined effort of experience and youthful energy ensuring our beach and local environment were well-supervised and major incident-free. Nature was also kind, with fine weather conditions prevailing and beach closures an uncommon event with even the local marine creatures maintaining a respectable social distance.

Many thanks must also go to the longer-term Patrol Captains, for their continued service, expertise and mentorship of younger members. Maintaining the vitality and proficiency of a patrol team can be challenging when the patrol area is quiet but, as we all know a pleasant afternoon watching beach-goers can quickly change, and competent leadership and strong teamwork skills ensure the best possible outcome can be achieved, whatever the situation may be.

Lifesaving Report (continued)

The challenge for Patrol Captains is maintaining skill levels of patrolling members, as our part of the coastline provides few surf-related issues for patrols. We are fortunate to have a considerable depth of knowledge amongst senior members who provide training activities during patrols and most patrol teams are now conducting frequent water-based patrols from rescue boards within the shark barrier zone, with a number of pre-emptive rescues and assists carried out as a result. Many tourists and young swimmers aim to swim out to the barrier, only to find it is beyond their capability. This is proving a new risk factor for patrols, and our patrols are adapting their patrol strategies to suit the increase in number of swimmers with varying degrees of aptitude.

As our season closed the last few weekends were crewed by smaller patrols than usual, owing to the COVID-19 pandemic. SLSWA deemed volunteer lifesaving to be an essential service and we continued as advised, minimising patrol numbers and taking extra precautions as recommended. Thus our season ended without the usual end of patrol picnics, pizza and clubhouse barbecues with no opportunity to thank all those team-members for their efforts during the season. If you have read this far, and belong to our lifesaving fraternity - thank you!

Patrol Members

Special mention must go to the patrol members who volunteer hours well in excess of their rostered duties, and those who perform multiple duties (Age Group Managers, ad-hoc Water Safety, off-site IRB duties) for which no credit may be derived, other than the personal satisfaction of a job well done. Special mention to Dominic Lawrence, whose season was interrupted by a fractured vertebrae, & James Jenkin who both completed in excess of 100 hours of Patrols.

Events

CSLSC provides water safety and first aid support to many events during the season, some of which provide a revenue source to the Club. Organisation of volunteers for these events remains a constant challenge, and the Club is reviewing methods of providing incentives for volunteers for these events to ensure we fulfil our obligations to event organisers without having to make last minute calls for assistance. Our small core of committed volunteers needs to expand and our highest commendation must go to those who give up extra time to ensure the success of these events. The Cottesloe Classic Mile®, Swim Thru Rotto, Rottnest Channel Swim, Swanny Ocean Classic and the Open Water Series Events, as well as numerous intra-club events require IRB drivers and crew, First Aid and Water Safety support and we are grateful to all members for their contributions to these events - particularly those that involve very unsociable starttimes, such as the Rotto Swim.

Drone Patrols

Drone patrolling continued this year, with James Jenkin training new drone operators to increase our drone patrol capacity. Unfortunately, the strict launch criteria and the increased numbers of beach visitors meant we were not able to utilise the drone to its full ability, however it is providing a useful addition to our surveillance resources when available.

Conclusion

On behalf of the Club it is with much gratitude that I thank all those involved in Cottsurf lifesaving for their past season's contribution, ensuring we upheld our community responsibility competently and diligently. As a 'newbie' to Surf Club administration, my personal thanks to Ditte van der Linde and Marg Bond for their patience and support, Courtney Franz and Ben Stephens for their training expertise and to all members from whom I have sought advice - it has been a pleasure getting to know members and gain insight into how I can assist the Club develop and expand our resources for the benefit of all. Thank you also to Liz Ross who is stepping down as First Aid Officer. A premature end to our season and radical changes to the outdoor lifestyle we take for granted hopefully has everyone looking forward to next season, when we hope 'social-distancing' becomes a phrase for the history books and we can continue striving to provide an excellent service to beach-goers, along with enjoying the benefits of our cherished Cott Surf Club.

Youth Development Officer Report

While the 2019/2020 season will long be remembered for the disruptions to our daily routines and its abrupt end due to COVID-19, there is still much to celebrate in the achievements made by our youth members. These achievements fall within all key pillars of surf life saving patrols, surf sports and training and education.

We started the season with a new group of U14s making the big transition from Nippers to Seniors when they joined the Titans. A testament to the enthusiasm displayed by this group was the large proportion that had completed their SRC training and gained their SRC Award before the start of the season. By the end of the season 23 of the u14s had achieved their SRC award and had been assigned to a patrol. In addition to these SRC awards, 20 Titans completed their Bronze Medallion. Out of a total of 154 registered youth (14-18 year old) club members, 109 (71%) have a SRC or BM award and have logged patrol hours this season - a great achievement and one that significantly adds to the club's capacity to meet its patrolling commitments. These impressive statistics reflect several years of hard work by the club trainers - in particular, Ben Stephens, Nicholas Hancock, Stephen Goddard, Libby Madden, Deborah Dean, Dominic Lawrence & Courtney Franz. We also acknowledge our own club Assessors and those members who helped with the various internal training components on the beach. Thanks also to Rob Czaplinski, Ditte van der Linde and Marg Bond for their organising the training courses & providing any information requested this season.

As with other seasons, the Sunday morning activities were well attended by the Titans with 40+ competitors competing most weeks in swim, sprint, board, beach flags, 2 km run and surf ski events. Many of the Titans also competed in the weekly club swim - a truly remarkable event that speaks volumes about the camaraderie and participation within the club. Where else in Perth do 14-15 year olds happily line up next to fellow club members, up to five times their age, to participate in a no holds barred swim race on a Sunday morning each week? A big thank you to the members who regularly give up their time to run these events each week - Peter Leaversuch, Natasha Leaversuch, Jim Laurenson, Gail Robertson, Helen Franks, Liz Ross, Murray Bridgland, Sonja Madden and Ben Stephens.

The abrupt end to the season was particularly disappointing to the very committed group of Titans and their coaches that had been training hard all season for the State Championships. While there was no opportunity to compete at the States, the skills and fitness achieved from all the training was on show at the Club Championships and will be a solid foundation to build upon next season. On behalf of all the Titans I would like to thank the coaches:



Jason Landwehr (Beach), Murray Bridgland (Swim), Wayne Adams (Ski) and Konrad Seidl (Boards) for the many hours of training they provided over the season.

Three Titans were selected to attend youth leadership camps run by SLSWA. Romy Bridgland (U14) and Adam Fortey (U15) were selected for the TOAD (Teamwork, Opportunities and Development) camp that was held at Rottnest Island in January 2020 and Angelina Kearney (U17) was selected for the RISE-UP camp that was held at Pemberton in January 2020. In addition, one of the Titans, Tahlia Fairhead (U15), was recognised as Cottesloe SLSC's nominee for her outstanding contribution in the areas of life-saving, training and surf sports and well as her enthusiasm and active participation with the club and in attracting new members at the inaugural 2020 Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation & SLSWA Youth Club Achiever Awards. Congratulations to all.

Finally, I would like to thank the Titans Officers (U15, U17 & U19 Officer, Jesse Tucek and U14 Officer, Rob Czaplinski) for their valued contributions to the management and mentorship of the Titans age groups this season.

Junior Activities Officer Report WOODSIDE NIPPERS

This, along with sponsorships from AGL and LotteryWest, resulted in each surf club being provided with essential equipment and merchandise to better facilitate the Woodside Nippers program. Cottesloe Classic Mile Report

The 2020 Cottesloe Classic® Mile, held on Saturday 11th January 2020, was again a great success, both as a showcase sporting event and as a fundraiser for the Club.

Entry numbers decreased compared to 2019, though still came in at slightly over 500. Factors that affected the entries for the event were:

- Uncertainty over the timing and location of the shark barrier
- Withdrawal of the Banana Boat Swimkids partners

The introduction of the shark barrier in October meant that the 3,000m and 1,600m courses had to be redesigned. The "Cottesloe Classic Mile©" did not start in the armpit of the groyne as it had done for most of its history, as it wasn't safe for swimmers to have to swim over the barrier or through gaps. Instead, both races started to the north of the barrier, with the out-and-back courses still finishing in front of the pylon. Redesigning those courses meant that the distances had to be re-measured and GPS positioning used to get the turning buoys into the correct locations. Serious swimmers can tell if the distance is out by as little as 25m.

The 2019 event had included swim/wade events for children between 7-12 years of age. This added over 100 swimmers to the total, with high hopes to double or triple that in 2020. Unfortunately, Banana Boat pulled out due to the uncertainty of competitor numbers across the six-event national series. Without the Swimkids financial support and merchandise, it wasn't considered practical to run those swim/wade races in 2020.

As usual, a team of over 80 volunteers, too numerous to mention individually, presented themselves to professionally manage the registrations, course and finish line set up and pack-up, all with a minimum of fuss. Members also assisted with race briefing, water safety, first aid and water bottle distribution to make sure the event went off without any serious incidents. Through the use of Blue Chip timing services we were again able to start the presentations within minutes of the last swimmer reaching shore.

The Club again enjoyed the support of a dedicated group of sponsors for the Cottesloe Classic Mile©:

• The primary sponsor was again Mainpeak Paddlesports (Richard Lushey). Mainpeak is the longest serving sponsor of this event and our Club. This was their 16th consecutive year of support for the Cottesloe Classic Mile. Their contribution provided line honour prizes and spot prizes





- Marbret International (Brett Huitenga) provided awesome beach towels
- Vidlers on the Beach (David Cookson), our most recent sponsor. They moved in over the road on Marine Parade and didn't hesitate to get on board immediately, providing vouchers for CCM age group winners and 3,000m place getters
- Town of Cottesloe great assistance with the logistics of the ECO Barrier and its effect on the swim courses
- Western Regional Municipal Council for the water refill stations
- Rottnest Channel Swim (CEO Nick Blackburn) for providing massive numbers of water bottles and loan of swim course equipment.

Key members and section coordinators on the day are Paul Gerrard, Mike Franz, Marg Bond, Graham Pember, Gail Robertson, Bec Czaplinska, Mike Ivey (setting the buoys), Anthony Paini and Owen Ashby. No less important are the water safety team and other important helpers who make this event happen safely and smoothly. An important shout out also goes to Connie Nicoletti-Lewins (The Red C Photography) who patiently took so many excellent action shots of the event.

The next Cottesloe Classic Mile® events will be held on Saturday 9th January 2021.

Veterans Report

The Perpetual Foundation Fund consists of donations and bequests from generous people in the Community who support our vital volunteer work to ensure our iconic lifesavers can continue to save lives on the beach.

As Chairman, I report that the Trustees of the Foundation, consisting of Robert Watkins, Margaret Bond, Bruce Simpson, Michael Franz and myself, met twice during the year. This year, there were no changes to the Trustees of the Foundation.

The role of the Trustee is to manage and administer the Fund and I thank these members for their contributions during the year, especially Margaret who researches the various investment options to be passed on to the Management Committee. Funds are invested in government guaranteed institutions to achieve the optimum return.

I am happy to report the Fund cash in bank balance as at 30 April 2020 was \$9,685.24 and interest received was \$20.90. Five Term Deposits totalling \$706K are now held on behalf of the Foundation. Therefore, total funds held as at 30 April 2020 were \$715,685.24. The Club increased it's funds transfers to the Foundation account this year and we would like to take this opportunity to thank them, the Cottesloe

Veterans and our donors for their generous donations & support to the Club &, in particular, the Foundation. Donations from the Club, Donors and Cottesloe Veterans (\$5K) totalled \$161,460 this year.

It is important that members are aware that as a Perpetual Fund capital is preserved. The Club's Management Committee can only access five percent of Fund without having to call a Special General Meeting and obtaining a majority at that meeting to access funds in excess of this percentage.



Notes to the Financial Statements

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report covers the Cottesioe Surf Life Saving Club Inc ("the Club") as an individual entity. The financial report is presented in Australian dollars, which is the entities functional and presentation currency.

The financial report consists of the financial statements, notes to the financial statements, the officers' declaration and auditors reports.

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for use by the Management Committee. The Management Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity.

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015, Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee has determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires the Management Committee to exercise its judgment in the process of applying the entities accounting policies. There are no areas identified involving a higher degree of judgment or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements.

(a) Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the presentation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented, unless otherwise stated.

(b) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Club and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Membership fees

Membership fees are recognised at the time of receipt.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time of receipt.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised on receipt.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

(c) income tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(e) Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

(f) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets to the Club commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

The depreciation/amortisation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Property, plant and equipment Plant and equipment Depreciation rate

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to the statement of comprehensive income.

Depreciation has not been applied to Buildings which are located on land registered in the name of the Club.

(g) Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

(h) Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Club prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(i) Inventories

Inventories consist of bar and apparel stock and are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads, if any.

(j) Leases

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(k) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Club's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Club to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred,

(i) Goods and Services Tax ("GST")

Revenues, expenses, and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office.

In these circumstances the GST is recognised as a part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST, where GST applies.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority.

(m) Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures are adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(n) New, revised or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Club has adopted all the new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for a charity or not-for-profit entity registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission during the current reporting period. The adoption of these new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations has not resulted in a significant or material change to the Club's accounting policy.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF COTTESLOE SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC.

Report on Audit of the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Club), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2020, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in the Basis of Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying financial report of Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is in accordance with Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012, S. 20 of the Charitable Collections Act 1946 and Part 5 Division 1 of the Associations Incorporation Act 2015, including:

- a. giving a true and fair view of the Club's financial position as at 30 April 2020 and of its performance for the year ended; and
- b. complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1, Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Regulation 2013 and Part 5 Division 1 of the Associations Incorporation Act 2015.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The Club recorded cash and cash equivalent totalling \$904,494 on the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2020, which \$51,240 of the total amount was held in a term deposit account and \$525 was for the balance of the Caltex Fuel Card. We were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about the ownership of such term deposit account and the existence of such Caltex Fuel Card balance. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to these amounts were necessary.

The Club recorded grant income totalling \$29,394 and sponsorship income totalling \$70,471 respectively on the statement of comprehensive income, which \$6,300 of the total grant income was for the Nipper Boards received from Surf Life Saving W.A. and \$5,000 of the total sponsorship income was for the sponsorship received from Capstone Health Pty Ltd. We were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about the accuracy of such amounts. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to these amounts were necessary.

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for us to perform auditing procedures to satisfy ourselves that all donations and cash takings have been received and recorded in the accounting records. Accordingly, our examination relating to donations and cash takings was limited to the amounts recorded in the financial report.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Registered Entity in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Club's financial reporting responsibilities under the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012, Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Regulation 2013 and Charitable Collections Act 1946 and the committee's financial reporting responsibilities under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The management committee is responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012, Charitable Collections Act 1946 and the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the committee is responsible for assessing the Club's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee either intends to liquidate the Club or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Club to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
