# OBJECTS

- 1 To promote those objectives endorsed by Surf Life Saving Western Australia
  - a) To promote and enforce the work of Surf Life Saving, the resuscitation of the apparently drowned and the application of first aid on the beachfront between Cable Beach, Mosman Park and Napier Street, Cottesloe.
  - b) To carry out patrols in accordance with the regulations of Surf Life Saving Western Australia and provide the necessary efficient life saving equipment.
  - c) To co-operate with other organisations in enforcing life saving methods and equipment.
  - d) To educate the public surf awareness and current resuscitation procedures and encourage members of the public to gain awards as permitted by Surf Life Saving Western Australia.
  - e) To partake in competitions and events in all surf life saving areas and other areas permitted by Surf Life Saving Western Australia and to sponsor members to complete.
  - f) To co-operate with the Town of Cottesloe in possible improvements to beach facilities.
- 2 In Addition:
  - a) To acquire by purchase, exchange or otherwise whether for an estate in fee simple or for any less estate lands and tenements or real personal property or any tenure thereof, whether subject or not to any changes, or encumbrances, and to erect, replace, maintain, reconstruct, adapt and furnish any offices, buildings, or lands, tenements or property or any part thereof after approval by a Club General Meeting.
  - b) To borrow any monies required for the purpose of the Club upon such terms and conditions as may be determined and for that purpose to mortgage, pledge or otherwise charge any real or personal property of the Club.
  - c) To invest funds of the Club, when available, providing that investments shall be in trustee securities only.
  - d) To employ staff as required to administer and promote the objectives of the Club.
  - e) To do all or any of the matters authorised either alone or in conjunction with any person, company or unincorporated body through any factors, trustees or agents.
  - f) To do all such things as they appear to the Club to be incidental or conducive to the attainment of the foregoing objectives or any of them.

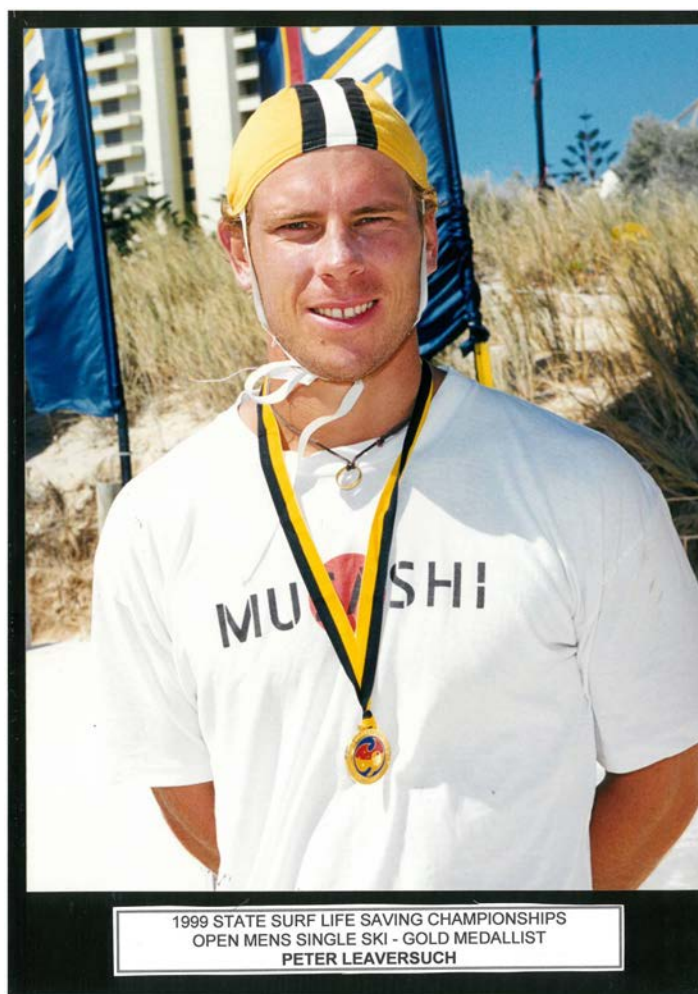

## BRUCE FURZE GASTON

13 April 1921-18 May 2016

Such an enormous amount has been written about Bruce, that I really am at a loss to know where to start.

Firstly, a magnificent Eulogy at his funeral service, given by his daughter Rowena on behalf of the family, followed by a great Obituary in the West Australian written by Patrick Cornish, secondly, a book edited and contributed to by Bruce himself titled "Air Crew for The Duration of WWII". Whatever I do, it will and cannot be brief as the story is full of great deeds and family love and affection; but I will try and summarise from all that has been written.

Bruce was born in Cottesloe to Malcolm and Doris (nee Furze) and was the eldest of four boys Doug (Decd), Murray and Ian (Decd). His father worked in the Goldfields so Bruce lived with his Aunt Eve in Cottesloe when he started school, where he attended Cottesloe Primary and then Fremantle Boys High. As a lad Bruce was gifted both academically and athletically. He often ran to the beach for a quick swim before attending school in Fremantle and joined the Cottesloe Surf Club as a 13 year old (more on that later). As part of his schooling he was taught woodwork, which he practised throughout his life, spending long periods in his shed making long lasting solid pieces of furniture.

After leaving school he commenced a career as an engineering cadet with the Public Works Dept that was interrupted by the outset of the war. At the age of 20 he joined the RAAF and was sent to the UK where he was seconded to the RAF as a B24 Liberator pilot. It was during this time that Bruce tutored and befriended Sir Peter Yarranton, who as you are aware, eventually became "The Vets" Patron. During his time in the RAF Bruce was responsible for the sinking of a German UBoat266, one of the many feats of which earned him a Distinguished Flying Cross for outstanding service. One of the funnier sides of his service was when he and his crew were recalled from a two-day rest period in the Mediterranean in Gibraltar. Upon take off and after applying full throttle, Bruce as surprised to discover that the plane was reluctant to lift off so hurriedly adjusted trim, flaps and boost. Eventually in the air his crew revealed that they had bought dozens of bottles of cheap sherry in Gibraltar, with money borrowed from Bruce, which were stowed in the rear near the parachutes. The crew also begged Bruce not to fly higher than 2000 feet for fear of the bottles popping their corks and Bruce blowing his loan to the crew.

Resuming his civilian life back in Perth he resumed his engineering cadetship with the Public Works Dept. where he met his bride to be Muriel Attey. They were married on the 9th August 1947 and were together for 68 years. The union produced four children Leonie, Geoffrey, Rowena and Jacqui. They built their home in Waratah Ave which remains the family home to this day.

Bruce, having gained his bronze no. 13428 on the 4th December 1937, re-joined Cottesloe Surf Club and was the driving force behind the club's resurrection after the war. He was to become President at the tender age of 27 and his huge contribution to the club has been recognised in "The Premier Club". He was awarded Life Membership in 1957. Apart from his administrative duties, he also was very much a part of Cottesloe's prominence in swimming and R&R events, winning many club and state titles.

After his retirement he was to join swimming groups such as Claremont Aussi, Beatty Park Bears and Cottesloe Crabs and enjoyed his weekly Sunday swims with "The Vets". During this time he held 28 state records, 12 national records and was among the top 10 in listings with the Aussi group. His study was decorated with his many medals of which he was immensely proud.

Not satisfied with his swimming achievements, he joined the Royal Perth Yacht Club in 1960 & became involved with outboard motorboats. He had designed and had built his own boats, and with son Geoffrey competed with great success, often achieving 1st place in a Saturday competition. He formed the outboard Boating Association and was President for 7 years. He was an executive member of the water safety division of the National Safety Council and Secretary of the WA Aquatic Council. The man never seemed to know when to stop.

His employment took him to the Department of Industrial Development and in 1968 the Government sent him to London, to work in Western Australia House on the Strand, where he was to become an enthusiastic industries promotion office, attracting British and European firms to invest in his homeland. The whole family sailed by ship to take up this appointment.

Bruce in his spare time was a pioneer of the Ledge Point development and, some 60 years ago, he purchased a block at the first auction. He built an asbestos house of his own design with help from his friends. The family spent many of their holidays at Ledge with Bruce working during the week and joining them on the weekend with

a fresh supply of food and provisions. Family and their needs were always upper most in Bruce's mind with celebrations of Birthdays a top priority.

Among his other interests was a keen interest in photography and, prior to the arrival of TV at Ledge, the family and grandchildren spent many a night reviewing slides and photos with much laughter at the odd humorous photo or slide. In his retirement Bruce and his bride Muriel enjoyed several cruises and joined the Grey Nomad society. He instilled in his children a sense of responsibility and love of family and was a true and trusted friend to many; always willing to help and assist where needed and ever ready to offer advice.

The Club has lost a true and valued member and we offer Muriel, brother Murray and the children our sincere sympathy.

## COLIN JAMES BURLING

20 November 1939 - 26 February 2016

Colin Burling was an inspiration with his commitment to family, work, Surf Life Saving, Rugby, winter swimming and Indonesia. He was larger than life, a tower of strength whose wisdom, one-liners and musical choices will stay with us forever.

Colin's involvement with Cottesloe SLSC began in 1963 when he met the captain of the Cottesloe Ladies Surf Club, Jean Gilbert. This meeting resulted in Colin & Jean getting married in August 1964. Colin did his bronze in December 1964 and became a Cottesloe boatie.

Colin and Jean left Perth in May 1965 for Sydney and joined North Narrabeen SLSC. Colin continued his rowing becoming a boat sweep and was an excellent belt swimmer beating Tuppy Lahiff in the belt at the annual North Narra vs Whalebeach carnival. Whilst at North Narrabeen surf club, Colin held the positions of Patrol Officer, Boat Captain, Nipper Manager and carnival official and was awarded Most Outstanding club member in 1972/1973. His children (Clinton, Sandra, Tracy, Jacqui, Gail & Jeffrey) were born whilst the family was in Sydney. The family returned to Perth in 1974 with Colin returning to the boat arena. The children all share their parents love of surf life saving.

Over the next 40+ years, Colin and family made a huge commitment to Cottesloe SLSC, SLSWA and Surf Life Saving internationally. Colin held a number of positions at Cottesloe: Junior Activity Officer, Cadet Officer, U18 Officer, Deputy President, Chairman of House Committee, Aussies Touring Team Manager and most importantly to him, Handicapper. Part of his report in the 1995/1996 Annual Report read: "On commencement of this time-consuming and very important job, I suddenly found out where the real power in the club is. I had this feeling of immense power that I could & should shape the destiny of so many devoted members that previous handicappers described as "club ruffians & whingers". In true sportsman tradition, I decided that the only way that truth, goodness and the Australian way could triumph, was to be a fair, diligent, hard working and incorruptible person – yes, an honest handicapper". Colin assisted and managed the very popular Cottesloe Revues at the country carnivals for many years.



Colin held numerous education awards over the years including 40 years officiating and 30 years instructing and assessing. He was known as "the Volga Boatman, voice of the west", commentating at local and Aussie championships where he was well known for his articulated and sometimes "animated" commentary! He was Liaison Office for NSW State Team and South African team as well as being part of the instructional team to Bali upon which he received a 20 year Citation of Merit service award.

His other passions were Cottesloe Crabs winter swimming club of which he became a Life Member, rugby league, rugby union and P.O.M.E.S. golden oldies.

With his health slowing him down, Colin decided the best thing he could do was go cruising. Colin and Jean spent many wonderful years cruising and, after spreading the news, were often joined by a number of good friends.

Colin will be sorely missed by all at Cottesloe SLSC as well as the many other clubs along the east and west coasts. Our deepest sympathy to Jean, Clinton, Sandra, Tracy, Jacqui, Gail & Jeffrey, their many grandchildren and the latest addition to the Burling clan, their great grand daughter.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Members and Supporters,

It is a great pleasure to present this 107th Annual Report of the Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club (Inc.) on behalf of the 2015/16 Management Committee.

Thanks to the dedication and hard work of many volunteers we can again say that 'no lives were lost on Cottesloe Beach!'

This season saw a transition in the President role with Ben Stephens stepping down in January 2016 after 3.5 years in the role and David Hounslow stepping into the position. The role of President of Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club is not an easy one and it is a credit Ben survived (mostly intact) for that time!

Given the transition it's appropriate to look back over the time as see what we achieved against what we set out to do, which was:

- Stabilise the rapid turnover of management committees;
- Rebuild the family culture of the club and the positive opportunities for youth;
- Continue to enhance the quality of our life saving services.
- Get "Cottesloe Caps in Competition";
- Offer social amenities to encourage members to get to know each other and have fun; and,
- Improve our cash at bank position to enhance our ability to undertake major capital works.

### **Stability**

The Club is getting to a size where it is more important than ever that it has stable leadership on the Management Committee. The in-coming Committee of 2012/13 included only one member who had served the year before and one other that had served two years previously. The Committee has been stabilised and most Committee Members are staying for more than one season, or if they are stepping down they remain involved in their area of interest – rather than being so burnt out that they drop out of the Club. This was achieved by backstopping new members to the Committee and ensuring they had support, as well as encouraging those with sub-committee experience to take on Management roles, so that the shock of running the surf club is not so great!

### **Families**

Even anecdotally it was clear that families are an important part of the Club. Two pieces of research, covering the period 1978 to 2015, indicated quite clearly that family involvement in the Club returned the most in terms of longevity of membership and adopting leadership roles in the Club. This was no different



across the recent Management Committees with overwhelming involvement as families or through the nipper movement. To support this important part of the Club the family membership categories was increased from 18 to 25 so that families can stay together longer. The family culture was also reinforced through fundraising activities, such as the sausage sizzle during Sculpture by the Sea, where children and parents are working side by side to raise funds for Club. It is also evident in some of our strongest patrols being built around families.

### **Lifesaving**

Saving lives is central to what we do. It starts with the young nipper learning to save their own life and progresses over time to learning to save others. Enhancing the quality of lifesaving is therefore a twofold process of member education and appropriate infrastructure. In recent years, thanks to a small band of dedicated trainers and assessors, the quality and breadth of courses has been vastly improved. This has had a direct impact on patrols with more IRB time on the water, as well as better treatment of spinal injuries and incidents requiring oxygen. In addition to skilled members it is important to ensure the equipment is at its best. Key items acquired are the Lifeguard Towers courtesy of the State Government and our Local Member the Hon Colin Barnett MLA, and the All-Terrain Vehicle and Inflatable Rescue Boat acquired via support from Surf Life Saving WA advocacy at a state level. In addition we have replaced our fleet of rescue boards from our own coffers and also with the generous multi-year support of the Fremantle Port Authority and this season support from Western Districts Lodge No 39 of WA Freemasons. Other notable purchases include radios, oxygen equipment and first aid kits, not to mention training manikins.



### **Competition**

In the surf life saving model competition should not be seen as a stand-alone activity separate from patrolling; rather it is a means to enhance skill and maintain fitness. In recent times this has become most apparent through watching development of the IRB racing team and the direct translation of the skills and experience they gain in winter to saving lives (typically of kite surfers) in the summer time. The lessons from this still hold true for the other surf sports disciplines and the confidence of kids coming through the nipper program and jumping on a rescue board during a SRC of bronze course is marked.

The aim in the competition space from the last four years has just been to get 'Cottesloe Caps in Competition'. Through the efforts of Anthony Whelan, Peter and Natasha Leaversuch and in the juniors, Glenn Eldon, we are seeing more caps in competition and now we are seeing the standard rise as the competitors gain in confidence. Thanks in particular to Nic Blackburn, who first as Board and Ski Captain, and for the last two seasons as Club Captain, has brought a great deal of enthusiasm to the competition space and has been a great champion of initiatives such as the Board and Ski subsidy to encourage private ownership of craft.

### **Social amenity**

We undoubtedly have the best location on the coast. We undoubtedly may be a little biased. The two opportunities we have with our building are to derive an indirect benefit from the building through private functions so the funds can be return to the benefit of members or provide a direct benefit to members via educational and social functions. While the first example is most notably the hall hire for Sculpture by the Sea in March, the second set is demonstrated through the education courses as well as Friday nights and special functions. Friday nights came in for focus this season with an engagement of a series of food vendors to offer different food on Friday night. The aim is not only to generate bar profit, but principally so members can get to know one and other and it becomes another reason to stay in the Club rather than a reason to leave. This will be enhanced in the 2016/17 season as we are set to see food return, in addition to a series of concerts or parties for different demographics of our Club.





### **Cash for Capital Works**

Related to the matter of social amenity is the acknowledgement that the building is past its prime and that we now, in some respects, lag behind all other surf clubs. In other respects we are now better placed to see what has worked well and what has not in their building programs. Two things are central to any major capital works program – members pulling in the same direction and cash resources. In recent years we have focused on building the cash resources of the Club to better position ourselves in whatever capital project we engage and are some \$500,000 better off than when we started (included the generous bequest of the Est of Norma Matheson). Members pulling in the same direction can be stymied somewhat by ego and personal agendas but, for the most part, the Club does seem less fractured than in times past.

### **Thank you**

Thank you to all the sponsors and supporters of the Club. You are there with us on the beach and in the training room and are an integral part of saving life on Cottesloe Beach.

Thanks to the Town of Cottesloe, with whom we have built a strong working relationship both with the staff and elected representatives. It is not an easy role managing Perth's most popular beach and we appreciate the consultative and supportive approach the Town takes with the Club.

Thanks to the Age Group Managers and Patrol Captains, who are very much the front line of service delivery on the beach and do a fantastic job.

Thanks to all our volunteer members who give up their time to patrol the beach, support our activities or help the kids. Special mention, as always, to Marg Bond, Barry Olson and Owen Ashby who go above and beyond each year in keeping the administration and facility ticking over. To all volunteers - we wouldn't exist without you - so thanks very much!

Thanks to our staff across the season including Ruth Turnbull, Katie Fairhall, Ditte van der Linde in the Office and Mike McDonnell and Adriana Huskova the Bar, who have given their all in serving the members.

Finally, thank you to the 2015/16 Management Committee. It is mostly a thankless task running the Club and being responsible for difficult decisions taken in the best interests of the Club. Everyone's professionalism and lack of personal agendas has made it (mostly) a pleasure to work together across the season.

All the best for season 2016/17.

# CLUB REGISTRAR REPORT

A big thank you to Katie Fairhall and Ruth Turnbull for their efforts in the office over the season - they have now left employment with the club to look after the new additions to their respective families. Welcome to Ditte van der Linde in the Club Administrator role!

Robust membership is the cornerstone of any successful volunteer organisation and the need to attract new members and nurture existing members is critical.

Junior member and Active 18+ member numbers declined this season however it is pleasing to see that a large number of Cadet members became active members of the Titans Active 15-18 year age group.

463 members did not renew from last season which is in line with previous trends (460 did not renew the previous season). Table 1, over page, shows numbers in selective membership categories for the majority of non-renewing members.

Reduction in numbers of Associate members can be attributed to Management deciding that parents of Minnows (5 & 6 year olds) did not have to join as part of a family membership; with the trade-off being a higher Minnow fee if only the child joined.

The Club Captain, Chief Instructor and a number of enthusiastic, active members attended the University of WA Orientation week to increase awareness of the Club and hopefully attract new members for the 2016/17 season.

Thank you to parents of our Junior members who also hand out flyers at other sporting events.

The Club had 336 new members join last season compared to 382 the previous season. See Table 2, over page, for comparison in majority of membership categories.

The challenges in membership continue to remain around nippers.

The Table 3, over page, details the different membership categories and number of members for last season compared to previous years.

Table 4 over details members transferring to other clubs, and whilst the numbers may seem high on first glance, the majority transferring were not current members.

Of the 21 members who transferred to Fremantle SLSC, only 6 were financial members from the 2014/2015 season; 13 members transferred to North Cottesloe

of which 3 were from the 2014/2015 season & 1 had joined Cott in error.

14 members transferred to Cott from Nth Cott and 13 from Swanny (12 of which joined our gym when Swanny decided their gym was for active members only).

Thank you to our loyal band volunteers at the Club's Open Day in September who continue to support the club and provide invaluable insight in what being a member of Cottesloe SLSC means to our prospective members. As in previous years, Junior members continued to represent the majority of new members who joined on the day. This event continues to play a vital role in attracting new members and showcasing educational services prior to the start of the season. Admin will need to ensure that all publicity avenues are enabled this coming Open Day.

Members were again encouraged to pay their fees online. Competition fees were charged again this season to partially cover the cost of competition and it is hoped that the new Club Captain will take ownership and ensure members are advised that they will not be entered in carnivals unless fully financial.

Fees are usually due on 01 July each year. The Club has changed its Financial Year and will now need to look at a membership year as part of the Constitution and By-Law revamp. Also, as Election of Office Bearers form part of the Annual General Meeting held July annually, existing Treasurer and Secretary should be looking at fees for the following season in order to present them to members at the AGM.

Thank you to the many volunteers and supporters who also assist me each year with the CottMile registrations. Your support to myself and the club helps make this one of the key fundraising events for the club.

Congratulations to our nominees for the WA Awards of Excellence Awards and, in particular, Eliza Jackson and Jarrad Davies, who were finalists in their respective categories. A big thank you to Paul Gerrard, Chairman of the Awards Committee, for his dedication to each application.

Please continue to tell your friends and family about activities held at Cottesloe SLSC, the "Premier Club" and what being a member means to you. I look forward to seeing you all again next season.

I take the credit and pass complaints to Greg. The system works well.

As a new boy in the club, I have been humbled by the experience of working alongside members who have been here for half a century and I thank you for this opportunity.

Over the season we averaged 53 swimmers per Sunday with a peak of 86 swimmers on the 11th Oct 2015 for a total of 204 swimmers competing in 26 races. This compared to last year's average of 55 swimmers per Sunday with a peak of 84 on the 9th November 2014, for a total of 179 swimmers in 24 races.

The club swim website recorded 8,221 hits from 1,213 regular returning computers. Each hit poured over the race results for an average of 4 min 30 sec per hit, with weekly hits averaging 172 and peaking at 261 hits in the week of 25 Jul 2015. This compared to last year when the website recorded 1,386 hits from 555 regular returning computers and each hit poured over the race results for an average of 6 min 10 sec per hit, with weekly hits averaging 52 and peaking at 156 hits in the last week of March 2015.

Cottesloe's boat section enjoyed a host of great successes this past summer. These successes included a podium finish for each crew at the State Titles as well as sending several crews over to the Sunshine Coast Aussies in April.

The season began in Spring 2015 with a healthy boost in numbers from last year. This increase in participation set the tone for the season ahead, as getting bums on seats (literally) is the key to a competitive boat arena.

Two Under 23 women's crews, an Under 23 men's crew, an Open Men's crew and a host of masters' crews represented Cottesloe throughout the summer.

At the States in March, the U23 Women's crew (Cottesloe Cruisers) featuring Bec Bonwick, Tessa Hillard, Jess Fitzgerald and Ness Pierluigi took out the silver with Paul Beattie sweeping, while the other U23 Women (Cottesloe Cookies & Cream) followed closely over the line with a bronze to assert Cott's dominance over the arena.

The U23 men (Cott Casuals) took home the silver medal in a photograph finish between first and fourth. The Open Men – Stu McKinnon, Jackson Dennis, Tim O'Shannassy and Josh Gray - joined the party with silver in the big race of the day.

To top it all off, Cottesloe took home 2 gold medals in the Masters State Titles at Secret Harbour. In the 140yrs division, Stuart McKinnon, Jeff Burling, James Dalton and Joe Morris were steered over the line in first place by Paul Beattie. Burlo then took the sweep oar off Paul as he jumped in the boat to row with Peter Kuhne, Dean Davidson and Gavin Ponton. They narrowly missed out on bronze in the 200yrs division. Finally, in the 220yrs, Cottesloe grabbed another gold with the Harmony crew, Owen Ashby, Ian Johnson, Glendon Lane, Peter Rattigan and Jeff Burling (sweep), impressing yet again.

Then in April, Harmony and the U23s crews jetted off to Queensland to represent the club at Aussies in the highlight event of the year. Unfortunately, we were unable to replicate the success from States but all crews were very competitive nonetheless. The Harmony crew left it all on the water in their two heats for the 260yrs category against the best crews the country has to offer and did the club proud.

Sarah Chang, Anne Chang, Pip Eaton and Anna Ross came together in a very tough U23 arena to produce some great rowing in tough, choppy conditions; including placing third in one of their heats.

Andrew Colvin, Daniel Hall, Jackson Howson & Jarrad Zylstra competed in the U23 men's arena. After a slow start to their Aussies campaign, they managed to pull across the line in first place in their final heat to get through to Saturday's quarter final where they were knocked out by the eventual gold medallists. The steady head of Jeff Burling in the sweep helm guided all crews throughout their races and the event itself with his wealth of experience at the top level. All in all, a very strong performance for Cottesloe against the country's best.

The successes of 2016 are attributed to the commitment and hard work from every rower and especially the time and effort given by the sweeps and coaches Jeff Burling, Gavin Pascoe, Paul Beattie, Owen Ashby and Geoff Dienoff. # LIFESAVING REPORT

## Patrols

For the 2015/2016 season, our patrolling operation consisted of 14 patrols, coordinated by James Jenkin. The season was a busy one, with our members patrolling for a total of 7264 hours. The vast majority of patrol hours (78%) was done by the rostered patrolling members or their substitutes. The rest of the patrolled hours were completed by volunteers going above and beyond their patrolling requirements!

During that time our patrolling members were kept exceedingly busy administering first aid in 926 cases and performing 52 rescues. Most of the rescues were in shallow water, but 13 were further out so that the rescue board or the IRB was used. Unfortunately, our patrols were also kept busy by a spate of thefts between December and February. When they had a moment to spare, our patrols also undertook a staggering 1,860 preventative actions, with the majority of those being warning beach goers of potential hazards, such as jumping off the groyne.

Thank you to all our patrolling members for keeping our beach safe. In particular, I would like to thank the 53 members that completed 100% or more of their patrols – committed and reliable members such as you are the backbone of our patrolling operations.

Congratulation to those members who completed 100% or more of their patrols.

## Lifesaving Equipment and First Aid

The major equipment change this season was the introduction of new digital radios. Originally slated to be rolled out in October, unexpected difficulties with the stations up and down the coast meant that we had to wait until February to actually receive them.

I appreciate everyone's good-natured patience in the first half of the season while dealing with radios that made seamless communication a challenge! The new digital radios, of which we have 8, have a much clearer sound especially in windy conditions with loud ambient noises (e.g. in the IRB or out on the groyne) – although they still can't penetrate the walls of our boat shed...

The second change we have started to roll out is the stepwise acquisition of yellow NeAnn oxygen bags that will replace the older model silver OxyVivas over the coming years. The bags have a pocket for a defib and are easier to organise so you can have easy access to spare hoses, masks and airways. If you've never used one of these before, make sure to do so at your

proficiency next spring or ask one of the newer Bronze medallion holders for a demonstration.

A small, but impactful, change driven by our First Aid Officer, Gemmaley Walsh, has been the labelling of all equipment in the First Aid room. This has greatly increased the order and ease of use – thank you everyone for so readily adopting this system.

Thank you also to Fremantle Ports for the second rescue board we received from them this year. Having a good number of boards in good conditions is particularly valuable for larger water safety events such as the Cott Mile or the Open Water Swim.

## Training

For the trainers and assessors led by Nick Hancock, our Chief Instructor, the season always starts out with a bang – the double whammy of proficiencies and new courses means many hours spent down at the surf club every week. Thank you for the dedication, in particular to those that contribute year in year out!

This season, 286 of our members passed their Bronze proficiency, in addition to numerous IRB Crew, IRB Drivers, Spinal and Advanced Resuscitation proficiencies.

We are also very proud to welcome 29 Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and 50 Bronze holders into the fold of our patrolling members. Although assessment conditions were very tough for some of the courses, they persevered and received their awards – well done to you and the trainers!

Many of our members undertook advanced courses this season and as a result received a number of awards, namely 16 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, 8 Spinal Management, 6 First Aid, 2 Pain Management, 11 IRB Crew and 8 IRB Driver. A special mention also to Jesse Tucek and Charlie Kavanagh who were selected to become 2 of only 8 new Helicopter Crew for SLSWA's Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopters.

Trainers, assessors, I hope you're enjoying the break and are getting some rest, as October is just around the corner...

## I.R.B. OFFICER'S REPORT

The IRB season starts earlier and ends later than any other part of Surf Lifesaving, lasting from August to June, leaving just one month without the extensive use of our equipment.

When the last season had already finished for most members, the 2015 IRB racing season started. It was our second season of racing, so our learning curve was still quite steep going from a series of Disqualifications (DQs) to ever more steady results especially with the female team who raced to a third place twice.

While it was undoubtedly a fun experience, it was also a great learning opportunity for honing our crew and driver skills. Not only did we learn to comfortably drive an IRB in winter conditions with huge shore breaks, we quickly recognised a very big part of every race is about safety. This focus on safety translates to a better awareness of these issues during the main season, positively impacting driving and crewing when doing water safety or being on patrol.

I want to thank Sharyne Alberts whose initiative and drive was key to the Cott racing teams second season: she organised our entries to the races, trainings, race days, learned all the rules, taught us to follow them and so much more. I also want to thank Jo Cammack who helped a lot getting us organised on a race day, handling the IRBs and getting us sorted that everybody knew what to do next.

The second big event was the inaugural IRB Prime Rescue Event in Lancelin organised by Fremantle SLSC at the end of August. The race concept was developed from the recognition that in recent years IRB rescues are becoming more common on our coast and require good all round rescue skills to cope when our equipment fails us – especially for kite surfer rescues which can be quite far out to sea. To this end, the race involved 8 legs such as different driving techniques over a longer distance, board paddling, swim with a rescue tube tow, IRB recovery paddle, IRB carry and just to finish off a 2km beach run! The two Cottesloe teams did well, we came fourth and fifth in the end. And we won the bonus race which was an inshore run with increasing numbers of people in the boat for each leg. Overall we learned a lot and we could intensify the relationship with the IRB team of Fremantle SLSC.

During the season, the IRBs provided water safety for the Sunday morning events, focusing especially on the Junior activities. This means having the IRB set up intime but also ensuring that every patrol has a driver and crew. This season we had a driver on almost every Sunday morning patrol which is a huge improvement from last season! The IRBs were also used for water safety for various

events during the season such as the Rottnest Channel Swim, the Open Water Swims at Cottesloe and Champion Lakes, the Cottesloe Classic Mile, the Cottesloe Triathlon and the Cott to Swanny Swim Through. Additionally, our club members also provided water safety for a range of senior and junior carnivals which is a requirement for our members to compete. Our new crews took the opportunity to get to know different beaches and different conditions. If you don't compete, consider playing an equally important role in allowing Cottesloe to compete and volunteer for carnival water safety next season! Many thanks to everyone who got involved in providing water safety in the IRB this year be it on Sunday mornings, at carnivals and at the events mentioned above!

It took quite a few people to keep the IRBs running smoothly this season. I would like to thank Sharyne Alberts for her advice and help especially with IRB racing and getting the crew and driver courses going. Thank you to Danny Savage who is following me as IRB officer next season and who was a great help during the whole season especially because of his mechanical skills and his big enthusiasm. A big thank you to David Hounslow who jumped in whenever a driver or crew was needed, especially last minute on carnival days when we haven't had a designated crew or someone couldn't make it. Very special thanks go to Mike Ivey and Myles Kennington who not just started importing parts for the engines directly from Japan (up to 70% cheaper!) but also spent many hours repairing engines, bending prop guards and swapping bottom parts of the engines around. The repair sessions in Mike's garage were legend and will always be remembered! We finally got a team that works around the engines which makes it a lot easier to get a broken engine fixed for the next weekend and which saves the club a lot of money!

And last but not least a big thank you to all the IRB crews and drivers for volunteering your time and staying involved.

## COTTESLOE CLASSIC MILE REPORT

The 2016 Cottesloe Classic Mile was held in perfect conditions on Saturday January 2nd. Warm weather, clear and flat water, and no stingers made for a great day.

For the first time, we conducted three separate events on the day. Along with the traditional mile swim, we also conducted a 3.0 km race and a 400 m swim/wade event. These catered for those looking for a longer challenge as well as those novice and Junior swimmers for whom 1600 m was too long. Each of the races was well supported.

First off was the 400 meter race, with an "M" shaped course. This allowed for a wade around poles in waist depth water at the halfway point. Many of the younger swimmers were accompanied by their parents which was great to see.

The longer races were choreographed so that the courses merged and the first across the line would continue to be a swimmer from the Cottesloe Classic Mile, the traditional event. The distance swimmers set off 15 minutes ahead of the first wave of Mile swimmers, and headed south down to Pearse Street before turning north and merging with the mile course off The Slimy reef. All swimmers then completed the loop out to North Cottesloe and back, turning around the pylon to the finish line.

Line honours went to Rhys Mainstone, closely followed by Andrew Donaldson and Cottesloe son, Simon Huitenga. Both Rhys and Simon are vying for places on the Australian Olympic team in 2016 in open water swimming. First female was former member Heidi Gan, also an outstanding distance swimmer, followed by first-timer Samantha Watts and event legend Jaime Bowler. Prizes were predominantly awarded to the swimmers in the Mile race.

There was some excitement late in the race when the shark alarm was activated with some 30 swimmers still on the course. Our patrolling members acted quickly and efficiently to ensure that all swimmers were safely returned to the beach and accounted for.

Feedback so far is that participants were happy with the three events and would like this to continue for the future. There will almost certainly be some fine tuning of the events to make them safer and more popular. The Club was again supported by key sponsors Mainpeak, Fun's Back Surf and FINZ. Harvey Beef, Indiana Cottesloe

Beach and MaxiBlock Sunscreen assisted with prizes. Richard Lushey of Mainpeak was particularly helpful with feedback and suggestions for the race throughout the year. Mainpeak has been a generous supporter of the Club for many years now and this will hopefully continue into the future.

Key club members involved with the event include Graham Pember (sponsor liaison), Margaret Bond (registrations), Steppy Redbond (course layout and starting), Nick Blackburn (logistics and setup), Trevor Maybank (beach & water support), Owen Ashby (catering), Jim Laurenson and Gail Robertson (presentations) and Ruth Turnbull (media and mailouts). We are also grateful for the many active members, both young and old, who turned up to assist with registrations and provide water safety and first aid for the swimmers. Without this, the event would not go ahead.

We also thank Blue Chip Timing, through Stuart Fuller, who provide excellent registration, timing and results services for our event. Three events? - no trouble at all.

The next Cottesloe Classic Mile will be held on Saturday, January 7th 2017.

I also had a desire for our Nippers to embrace interclub competition and become more competitive at interclub carnivals. The great positive about surf lifesaving is that there are so many diverse events from March Past, R&R, beach sprinting, 1km run, beach flags, swimming, board paddling and relays, there is an opportunity for everyone to get involved and be part of the team. This change does not happen overnight and we have made significant improvements in this area during the season and set a bench mark on which we can improve on next season.

One of the improvements was the Beach and Water training sessions available to our Nippers midweek and on Saturday afternoons. These sessions would not have been available without our volunteer coaches who we owe a big thank you to. Stephan Gracie, Drew Masters, Jeremy Mulcahy, Jason Kennington, Marina Scully-Ward and Carla Payne. Many hands make light work and it is great to hear the coaches and Nippers already talking about next season.

There were some changes made by SLSWA to the junior activities age groups for this season with the U14's moving

up to the Youth area and competing at Senior Carnivals. The U10's were also given the opportunity to compete in Junior Carnivals along with the U/9's who were allowed to compete in U10 team events.

We had some great social events during the season starting with the Hawaiian Disco in October, the Christmas Party in December when Santa's arrival on the beach whipped the crowd and our Nippers into a frenzy.

The Club Marathon was also a great day and for the first time all age groups were involved. The U9's – U13's were given the opportunity to complete the long course of 2.25km while the U6's to U9's completed shorter courses set by their AGM's. Due to the involvement of parents many of whom completed the course with their kids the event was a huge success. The level of comradery amongst our Nippers was exceptional as every competitor was cheered through the finishing arch.

The marathon results were: handicapped first across the line Max Kaelin (U11) and the first girl to finish was Shannon Byrne (U11). The fastest boy was Ethan Duffy (U12) in 19.36 and the fastest girl was Charlotte Thompson (U13) in 22.04.

Out of the 90 surf and beach events Cottesloe gained 59 points and attained a top 6 finish gaining championship points in 22 of these events.

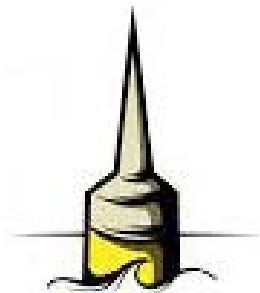
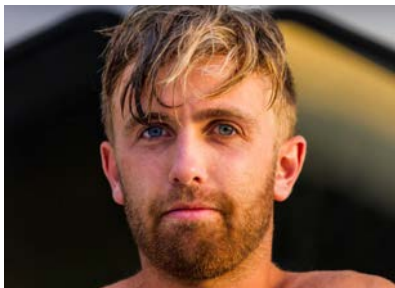

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Based on the final set of accounts the Club returned a surplus of \$347,126 for the 12 months to April 2016. As at 30 April 2016 the total net assets of the Club were \$1,624,826 the Club's cash position grew to \$694,622 and included the Club's Perpetual Foundation Reserve which totalled \$450,538.

The most significant financial impact on the Club was the bequest by the late Norma Matheson of \$300,000. Little is known about Norma Matheson's early involvement with the club, however the Rise Network's website states that she was born in Subiaco in 1919 and had an idyllic childhood growing up close to her beloved Cottesloe Beach. Norma's bequest serves as a reminder of how lucky we are to be charged with patrolling the premier beach in Western Australia. I have re-opened the guest book of her online obituary for members to thank her, belatedly, for such a generous contribution.

The proceeds of Norma's bequest were contributed to the Perpetual Foundation and joined the additional contributions made by the club and the veterans of \$17,500 during the year. I hope that future Management Committees will continue budget for increasing contributions to the Perpetual Foundation. The capital of the Perpetual Foundation is preserved in the future of the club and must be invested in bank deposit or real property, management can only access five percent of the Foundation without having to call a Special General Meeting, where a majority of members attending must then endorse access to funds.

This year the Finance committee and the Facilities committee combined to form a Commercial Committee and I am grateful for the help of Mike Ivey, Patricia Carmichael, Peter Berry, Barry Olson, Owen Ashby and Ben Stephens (de facto). Some of the many things that have been achieved include the gate to the courtyard, the new TV's and central streaming hub, the improved kitchen counters and oven's and most importantly the new ceiling in the Don Morrison room (10 year too late). The Commercial Committee met seven times during the year and we have found that the ability to combine budgeting for projects, with the most up to date financial information, expedited these improvements.

In past years I have had many club fundraising events to congratulate, this year with the cessation of Havaianas Thong Day, no Pylon Club, and only core members focusing on the Street Appeal, the fund raising has been a touch tepid. A few bright spots included, a refurbished Cottesloe Mile, the Boaties Quiz night, a prudent Apparel Shop and the always well managed Cottesloe Café. These areas/events add to the well-being of the club both financially and socially. Remember you don't need to be wealthy at our club to contribute a lot of money to it, just stick up your hand and organise one of the fallen from grace fundraising events.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report covers the Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club (Inc) ("the Club") as an individual entity. The financial report is presented in Australian dollars, which is the entities functional and presentation currency.

The financial report consists of the financial statements, notes to the financial statements and the officers' declaration.

#### Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for use by the Management Committee. The Management Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity.

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Associations Incorporation Act 1987, Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee has determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

#### *Historical cost convention*

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### *Critical accounting estimates*

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires the Management Committee to exercise its judgment in the process of applying the entities accounting policies. There are no areas identified involving a higher degree of judgment or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements.

#### (a) Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the presentation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented, unless otherwise stated.

#### (b) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Club and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

#### *Membership fees*

Membership fees are recognised on receipt in the period covering the surf life saving season of activity, i.e. October to March.

#### *Donations*

Donations are recognised at the time of receipt.

#### *Interest*

Interest revenue is recognised on receipt.

#### *Other revenue*

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

#### (c) Income tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### (e) Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

#### (f) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets to the Club commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

The depreciation/amortisation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Property, plant and equipment	Depreciation rate
Plant and equipment	20%

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to the statement of comprehensive income.

Depreciation has not been applied to Buildings which are located on land registered in the name of the Club, under a Crown Grant.

(g) Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

(h) Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Club prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(i) Inventories

Inventories consist of bar and apparel stock and are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads, if any.

(j) Leases

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(k) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Club's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Club to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(l) Goods and Services Tax ("GST")

Revenues, expenses, and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office.

In these circumstances the GST is recognised as a part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST, where GST applies.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority.

(n) Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures are adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(o) New, revised or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Club has adopted all the new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for a charity or not-for-profit entity registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission during the current reporting period. The adoption of these new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations has not resulted in a significant or material change to the Club's accounting policy.
